

No Smoking Policy

1. Purpose

This policy has been developed to protect all employees, students, customers and visitors from exposure to second-hand smoke and to assist compliance with the No smoking law of July 2007. Exposure to second-hand smoke, also known as passive smoking, increases the risk of lung cancer, heart disease and other illnesses. Ventilation or separating smokers and non-smokers within the same airspace does not completely stop potentially dangerous exposure.

2. Policy

It is the policy of Shockout Arts that all of our workplaces are smoke-free and all employees have a right to work in a smoke-free environment. Smoking is prohibited throughout the entire workplace with no exceptions. This includes company vehicles. This policy applies to all employees, students, visitors, and contractors.

In addition, smoking is not allowed anywhere in sight of the main buildings and other premises used by Shockout.

3. Implementation

Overall responsibility for policy implementation and review rests with the Health & Safety Committee. All staff are obliged to adhere to and facilitate the implementation of the policy. The Health & Safety Committee shall inform all existing employees, students and contractors of the policy and their role in the implementation and monitoring of the policy. They will also give all new personnel a copy of the policy on induction/enrolment week. Appropriate 'No smoking' signs will be clearly displayed at the entrances to and within the premises.

4. Non Compliance

Disciplinary action will be taken against any member of staff or student who do not comply to the policy as mentioned in the Staff Handbook and Student Handbook.

Visitors or contractors will be highlighted the possible fines as outlined in the law.
